(Kiel, 20th December 2021) On Thursday, 9th December 2021, the airport welcomed the new PC-12 from QinetiQ GmbH. The PC-12 is a single-engine turboprop multi-role aircraft from the Swiss aircraft manufacturer Pilatus Aircraft and was a real bright spot in the gloomy December sky in Kiel on Thursday. On the ground, photographers and 4 fire engines were already waiting for the official reception. Unfortunately, the traditional shower had to be skipped this time due to the frosty weather.

"The D-FTMT is now our 14th aircraft to be based in Kiel. This underlines our strong ties with Kiel Airport," says Robert Schenk, Head of Flight Operations at QinetiQ.

"I am delighted about the new aircraft and the commitment shown by our long-standing customer," says Volker Prange, Managing Director of the airport. "The arrival of a new aircraft is always something special and the welcome by the fire brigade is just nice to see as well. QinetiQ is the largest employer here at the airport and the new aircraft is another positive signal."
